God blesses us so that we can carry His name to the nations – that’s our heart cry at ANM, and it’s what 2025 was all about. Thank you for being part of this.

Right now, more than 3.5 billion people still have little or no access to the Gospel message. Because you stand with us, many of those unreached people are hearing the Good News, and local leaders are being trained to share it with others.

More specifically, in 2025 we were able to:

- Bless 162 ministries in 34 countries that typically lack regular support.
- Send ANM Regional Directors to meet face-to-face with over 77 ministry leaders in 27 countries, so they know they are not laboring alone.
- Lead 20 mission teams to serve alongside our international partners in strategic areas like Ghana, Laos, Cambodia, Bulgaria, Latin America, and India.

In this report, you will see how God is working through native missionaries to reach the unreached and strengthen His Church. And you will see how your partnership with ANM has helped make this ministry possible. Every story is a testimony to His faithfulness.

Thank you for standing with our native missionaries. Our work is not finished until every nation, tribe, people, and language has heard the name of Jesus and His message of salvation. By God’s grace, we will finish the job together.

11 ENCOURAGING CONFERENCES

Together we sponsored 11 conferences in 2025 that brought together missionary leaders from multiple ministries to learn from the Bible together, be refreshed, and remember that they don't labor alone.

3 MISSIONARY DINNERS

Missionaries from Mexico, Croatia, and Malaysia all joined ANM for missionary dinners in 2025. Over 100 people attended the events and had the opportunity to meet native missionaries, pray together, and encourage one another.

7 CRISIS RESPONSES

Native missionaries were equipped to quickly respond to crisis situations in Myanmar and Thailand, the Philippines, Cambodia, Israel, Lebanon, and Ukraine. Offering practical aid allowed them to share the hope of the Gospel with those who were suffering.

Bulgarian Children Hear the Gospel for the First Time

When believers come together, God uses those connections for new ideas and strategies. Jaap and Aziza, who were ANM field representatives and now Europe's regional directors, experienced that exciting connection firsthand at an annual Christian conference that brought together thousands of believers from across Europe. One group shared a Christian comic book called *Jesus Messiah*, which had been translated into many languages to help introduce young people to Jesus and the Gospel.

Jaap and Aziza immediately thought of Hari and Penka, missionary artists who are sharing the Gospel with unreached children in Bulgaria. But there was a problem: the *Jesus Messiah* comic book had never been translated into Bulgarian.

They discussed the possibility of a Bulgarian translation with the people sharing the book and exchanged emails with the hope of collaborating. When they returned home, they contacted Hari to ask if someone could translate the comic.

In their own words, they share what happened next. "In the end, Hari and Penka's son, Ivaylo, took on the translation together with Christiaan from Wycliffe. It's taken some time – Ivaylo is very thorough and careful with his work – but now the comic book is fully translated into Bulgarian!

"We're so thankful for Ivaylo and the time he's given voluntarily to this project. When we saw him in Bulgaria last month [September 2025], he shared how much he enjoyed working on it, and how reading through the Bible so carefully for the



translation helped him grow in his faith. That was really special and encouraging to hear. Now, the translation is finished and ready to be printed!"

Your generosity makes it possible for ANM workers to attend conferences and for native missionaries to be able to translate and print Gospel materials.

The comic books were printed and distributed in Christmas gift boxes that Hari and Penka and their team shared with Muslim-majority villages in Bulgaria. Hundreds of children excitedly opened their boxes and began reading about Jesus, their Savior, for the first time.



Thousands Pray to Receive Jesus in Israel

Despite ongoing conflict between Israel and Hamas, including bombing civilian areas, Beit Hallel continues to do ministry in Israel. The ministry has a Messianic congregation and does ministry activities such as humanitarian aid to war survivors and evangelistic events for unreached people. Their work is only possible because of your generous gifts.

In 2025, Beit Hallel hosted four major evangelism events – two in Nazareth and two in Jerusalem. The Nazareth events took place in March and October, while the Jerusalem events were held during the Shavuot holiday in June and again in December.

These gatherings created safe and welcoming spaces for prayer, spiritual conversation, and the public proclamation of the Gospel in a country with only 0.7% evangelicals. Many participants arrived carrying fear, grief, and unanswered questions. For them, these gatherings were more than events – they became moments of encounter that opened the door to salvation in Jesus, deeper pastoral care, discipleship, and connection to community.



Each event was followed by intentional personal follow-up so that those who responded were not left alone, but lovingly guided forward in Jesus' name. Between the four events, over 1,730 people publicly prayed for salvation. Praise God!

Everyone who prayed for salvation at these major events, as well as other interested seekers, new believers, and people in crisis, received support from the ministry, as Beit Hallel is dedicated to follow-up, pastoral care, and discipleship. Between phone calls and in-person visits, over 14,000 people or families received care.



8 New Churches in Kenya Grow Despite Challenges

Northern Kenya is predominantly remote, which makes sharing the Gospel difficult, and the tribes that live there have cultural and historical differences that only increase the difficulties. However, in 2025, native missionaries planted eight new churches there.

Regional Director for Africa Meseret Workelul shares more: "These new congregations are growing in faith despite challenges of distance, lack of shelter, and persecution. We continue to trust God to provide permanent church buildings in His perfect timing.

"We are grateful that through God's provision and your prayers, funds have been received to begin construction on one new church building, and the work will start today [October 22, 2025]. This

is a great encouragement to the believers who have been gathering faithfully under trees and makeshift shelters for worship. Please continue to pray that more church buildings can be completed for these growing congregations.

"One of the new churches was planted in a remote village near the border of Laikipia and Isiolo, where three tribes – Maasai, Samburu, and Turkana – live together. Despite cultural and historical differences, they are united through the Gospel of Jesus Christ. This new fellowship is a powerful testimony of reconciliation and peace in Christ.

"Through your partnership, the Gospel continues to advance, and lives are being transformed across Northern Kenya. Thank you."

Filipino Missionaries Share Hope in the Midst of Natural Disaster

On September 30th, 2025, a 6.9 earthquake struck Northern Cebu Island in the Philippines. It was the strongest earthquake ever recorded there, with thousands of aftershocks. Almost 80 deaths and 600 injuries were reported, along with the partial or total destruction of over 160,000 homes.

Only a month later, on November 4th, a typhoon hit the same area. More people died, and the already-struggling survivors lost what little possessions they had left.

With ANM's support, Dr. Linda of the Philippine Gospel Association (PGA) responded immediately to both disasters.

As people camped in tents, afraid of aftershocks, Dr. Linda and the Philippine Gospel Association got to work. Thanks to ANM's generous donors and increased focus on disaster response, we served over 700 households in 20 affected areas.

PGA provided:

- Vitamins and fever medications to 210 infants and toddlers
- Medical supplies, medications, and vitamins for adults in need, including a native pastor
- Blankets, mosquito nets, and food to families

Even though physical need was great, the top priority was sharing Jesus. In a country with over six million unreached people, sharing the hope of Christ after the disasters made a lasting impact. Thank you for standing with ANM to equip native missionaries to respond quickly to disasters and share the love of Jesus in physical ways.



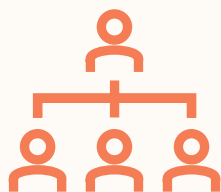
Our Three Main International Goals for 2026

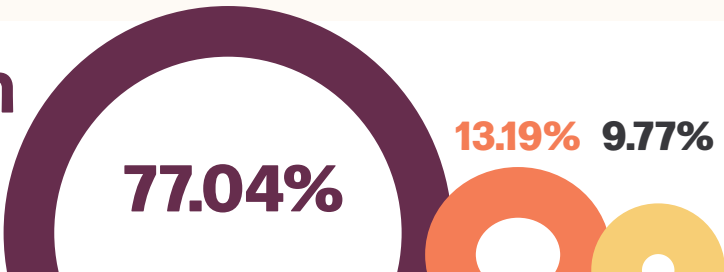
